Details of Expenditure: 2016-17		
Education City licence	£576.00	Education City is a primary resource to support children who have gaps in basic English skills. It is used extensively in the school's Literacy and Numeracy Workshop. The impact of the resource is measured by assessing progress in reading, writing and numeracy skills.
My Maths licence	£599.00	My Maths is a secondary resource to help consolidate mathematical skills across both Key Stages. Once a theme or topic is introduced, the resource helps to gain a deeper understanding so the concept can be applied more broadly.
Lexia	£1460.00	Lexia is a primary reading resource, used extensively in schools to support reading acquisition and comprehension. Reading is a skill that improves with practise and Lexia encourages reading enjoyment for our more reluctant readers. Children in Key Stage 3 at Oastlers enjoy Lexia daily.
Reluctant Reader books	£309.00	Children who are reluctant to read in school are a focus for improvement. The reading scheme encourages learners to read for pleasure. The resource of specialist books aim to attract disengaged readers back to reading as the content is aimed primarily at younger readers.
Literacy and numeracy support	£2056.00	The provision of bespoke support for individual learners provides 1:1 opportunities, identified by the school SENCO, in a quiet space proves effective for some of our less able readers who are reluctant to read aloud in class. The support improves self-confidence. The schools Literacy and Numeracy Workshop provides 1:1, paired or small group sessions to improve basic core skills enabling lower able groups to access the curriculum with confidence. This important resource has a proven track record for learner progress and overall achievement.

Class set of Kindles	£499.96	Younger children enjoy reading using technology. The Kindles provide a broader range of books within them and so encourage exploration of different types of books.
My Maths licence	£565.00	My Maths is a secondary resource to help consolidate mathematical skills across both Key Stages. Once a theme or topic is introduced, the resource helps to gain a deeper understanding so the concept can be applied more broadly.
Lexia	£2892.50	Lexia is a primary reading resource, used extensively in schools to support reading acquisition and comprehension. There is a range of fiction and non fiction literature as well as a space for group work in a comfortable and stimulating environment. Additionally, the interactive whiteboard and computers adds an ever greater dimension to this space dedicated to all things English and numeracy consolidation.
